
Dear Madam:

In a recent visit to the National Archives, Washington, D.C., I checked the Revolutionary War Pension File of Sterling Clack who lived in Sumner County, Tennessee, when he filed for pension in 1830. Among the other papers in the file was a letter from you asking for data on this soldier of the Revolution.

One of the earliest settlers in this County (Sevier) was Spencer Clack, also a Revolutionary soldier; his wife was Mary Beavers whom he married in Virginia. What data do you have on this Clack family that was not given in the Pension File of Sterling Clack? Some descendants have claimed that our Spencer had a brother named Sterling, but I do not know what the source of this claim is - perhaps you have material to prove this.

I shall be glad to exchange information with you on our Clack family if you are interested in corresponding with me.
